AIDS - Alaska

Through June 30, 1995, 305 Alaskans have been confirmed to have AIDS. Of these, 162 are known to have died. Of the 305 AIDS cases, 271 are in males and 34 in females. Data below employ the 1993 Expanded Case Definition for AIDS. All cases are shown as diagnosed in the year the person first met the revised case definition. Residence at time of diagnosis is shown by census area.







Cumulative Cases
