
## AIDS - ALASKA

Through June 30, 1996, 345 Alaskans have been confirmed to have AIDS. Of these, 191 (55%) are known to have died. Of the 345 AIDS cases, 303 (88%) are in males and 42 (12%) in females. Data below employ the 1993 Expanded Case Definition for AIDS. All cases are shown as diagnosed in the year the person first met the revised case definition. Note: 1996 data are for the period January through June, 1996 only.


**Exposure Category<sup>1</sup>**, N = 345






**Cumulative Cases**
