## FREE Intradermal Fluzone Vaccine Order Form

Sanofi Pasteur has made available, through the Alaska Immunization Program, 20,000 doses of FREE Intradermal Fluzone vaccine to Alaska for the 2011–12 influenza season. The vaccine is licensed for adults aged 18 years to 64 years. Fluzone information is available at: <https://www.vaccineshoppe.com/static/FluID2/fluid-video-desktop.html>

This vaccine is available on a first-come, first-served basis to providers/organizations that meet the following criteria:

1. A provider licensed to dispense vaccine (MD, DO, PA, ANP) must assume responsibility for proper vaccine storage and administration by signing this form.
2. The ordering provider/organization must have adequate dedicated refrigerator storage (biologics only, no food) for the vaccine, with a consistent temperature between 35°– 46° F.

Additionally, those who administer vaccine are required to do the following:

1. Keep a record of all doses administered. This record must include name, date of birth, address, and phone number of vaccine recipient, and be held for 1 year by the licensed provider and organization identified on this order form.
  2. Provide all vaccine recipients with a current Vaccine Information Statement (VIS) for inactivated influenza vaccine prior to vaccination (available at: <http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/pubs/vis/downloads/vis-flu.pdf>).
  3. Screen potential vaccine recipients for contraindications to vaccination (the vaccination screening form is available at: <http://www.immunize.org/catg.d/p4066.pdf>).
- **Providers/organizations in Anchorage** must order in increments of 10 doses and are required to pick up vaccine at the Alaska Epidemiology Depot (9210 Vanguard Drive, Suite 102A).
  - **Providers/organizations outside of Anchorage** must order a minimum of 30 doses and increments of 30 doses thereafter. The cost of shipping will be covered by the Alaska Section of Epidemiology.
  - Orders will only be accepted by fax (incomplete orders will not be processed).
  - Order confirmation/shipping information will be faxed to providers/organizations after the request has been processed.

## **Free Intradermal Fluzone Q&A Sheet**

### **Is the vaccine really free?**

Yes. The vaccine is free to every provider/organization that qualifies.

### **Who qualifies for the free vaccine?**

This vaccine is available on a first-come, first-served basis to providers/organizations that meet the following criteria:

- A provider licensed to dispense vaccine (MD, DO, PA, ANP) must assume responsibility for proper vaccine storage and administration by signing the order form.
- The ordering provider/facility must have adequate dedicated refrigerator storage (biologics only, no food) for the vaccine, with a consistent temperature between 35°– 46° F.

This may include public or private health care providers, social service agencies, companies, building or facility management offices, faith-based groups, arts organizations, governmental or educational institutions, schools, and other organizations.

### **Can a fee be charged for the free vaccine?**

It is expected and assumed that no one will charge a fee or submit an insurance claim for the vaccine.

### **Can a fee be charged to cover the cost of administering the free vaccine?**

Yes, providers may charge an administration fee for this vaccine.

### **What is required of those who receive the free vaccine?**

1. Keep a record of all doses administered. This record must include name, date of birth, address, and phone number of vaccine recipient, and be held for *one year* by the licensed provider AND facility identified on the order form.
2. Provide all vaccine recipients with a current Vaccine Information Statement (VIS) for inactivated influenza vaccine prior to vaccination (available at: <http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/pubs/vis/downloads/vis-flu.pdf>).
3. Screen potential vaccine recipients for contraindications to vaccination (the vaccination screening form is available at: <http://www.immunize.org/catg.d/p4066.pdf>).

### **How will vaccine be distributed?**

- *Providers/organizations in Anchorage* must order in increments of 10 doses, and are required to pick up vaccine at the Alaska Epidemiology Depot (9210 Vanguard Drive, Suite 102A).
- *Providers/organizations outside of Anchorage* must order a minimum of 30 doses and increments of 30 doses thereafter. The cost of shipping will be covered by the Alaska Section of Epidemiology.

### **How will orders be accepted and confirmed?**

- Orders will only be accepted by fax (incomplete orders will not be processed).
- Order confirmation and shipping information will be faxed to providers/facilities after the request has been processed.
